

The track numbers place these bands in chronological order, according to their first release on the label. The prefix of each file name is the catalogue number of that first release. At the very beginning (not as far back as dinosaurs or anything), the label shared the 'Magic Moments At Twilight Time' name with the band. The first prefix we used was simply 'C' for cassette, before moving on to 'MMATT' (we worked for months on that one), in July 1988, when the label went all official like. In April 1992, the label embraced the global underground movement and became Music & Elsewhere. The rest as they say, is history...



### The Disc;

LightScribe discs are a little prone to fading over time, so it's worth taking a few precautions with them. It's heat and light that do the most damage (lucky they're not read by lasers, eh?), so don't leave them in players for long periods, take it easy with use in cars and don't leave them on windowsills in glorious sunshine.

Apparently, even residual chemicals from your fingers can cause fading, common ones found in such everyday items as hand lotions and hair care products. So, if you avoid the sunlight, have dry skin and your hair looks like a haystack, at least your M&E CDR will look cool...





This promising combo came to us when they were all around 16-17 and already sounded impressive. In spite of being a little outside of our more usual musical territory, I was impressed by their youthful enthusiasm and talent and decided to give them a go. They topped the M&E chart in May 1997. Tragically, lead singer and quitarist. Matt Scales, died from a complication of cystic fibrosis, before he was out of his twenties...

Although merely a 12 minute cassette EP, and then only half of a double pack at that, this release remains a significant part of M&E history, being the very first one produced 'out of house'. Although, and perhaps ironically, it **was** recorded in my

house; it was entirely written, performed and produced by the Church Crookham duo of Philip Hutchinson (in the Columbo raincoat) and Peter Hussey, my sole contribution being "give me a fucking mince pie" on "Santa Claus Is The Anti-Christ". The band went on to produce a full album for us, the rather wonderful "Please Don't Touch My Yoghurt" (MMATT 32) in October 1989, presented to us as a finished master, thus setting the model for the M& E of

the future, on which it was reissued as M&E 042 in July 1992. This mini masterpiece, however, never saw the light of day again... UNTIL NOW!
